Honours Arts & Science and Global Peace and Social Justice ADMISSION

Completion of Arts & Science I with a grade point average of at least 6.0, including a grade of at least C in PEACJUST 1A03 or 1VM3, or if not taken, three units acceptable to the Global Peace and Social Justice Program.

NOTES:

- 1. Six units from the following list are required: ARTSSCI 3B03, 3BB3, one of 3RL3/3S03. Students who choose to take ARTSSCI 3RL3or 3S03 may only use one of those courses towards satisfying 3 units of the requirement. Students are encouraged, however, to take additional units from this list as an elective. 2. Twelve units of Upper-Level Inquiry beyond Level I are required.
